David Konstan is Professor of Classics at New York University. His research focuses on ancient Greek and Latin literature, especially comedy and the novel, and classical philosophy. In recent years, he has investigated the emotions and value concepts of classical Greece and Rome, and has written books on friendship, pity, the emotions, forgiveness, beauty, and love in its several manifestations. He has also written on ancient physics and atomic theory, and has translated Seneca's two tragedies about Hercules into verse. His most recent book is *The Origin of Sin: Greece and Rome, Early Judaism and Christianity*.
